

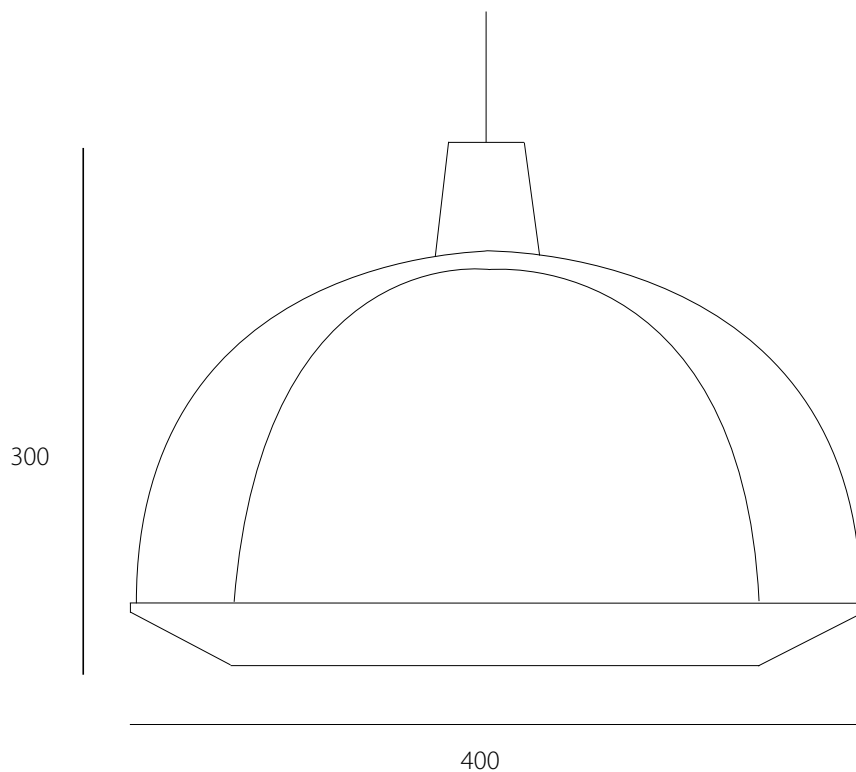
# KUPLAT (Bubbles)

Pendant lamp (1959)

Kuplat in Finnish means bubbles. Kuplat is a pure design classic by Yki Nummi. The lamp consists of two acrylic shades of different colours, one nesting inside the other. The white acrylic inner shade functions as a reflecting surface for the light. The outer transparent acrylic shade comes in various alternative colours. The two shades are mounted by a conical shaped white cup. The lamp is available in a number of different colours, for e.g. smoke grey and red. The inside shade is always white.

Material: PMMA acrylic, aluminium

## Yki Nummi

Designer, artist (1925 - 1984)

Yki Nummi worked as a lighting designer at the Stockmann-Orno lighting fixture factory from 1950 to 1975, designing hundreds of lighting fixtures in this period. He is still considered to be among the most remarkable Scandinavian designers of his time. Nummi's lamps received awards at the Triennials in Milan in 1954, 1957 and 1960.

# KUPLAT

University studies in mathematics and physics and a degree in decorative painting gave Yki Nummi a firm foundation on which to experiment with the relationship of light and colour in his lighting fixture designs.
