

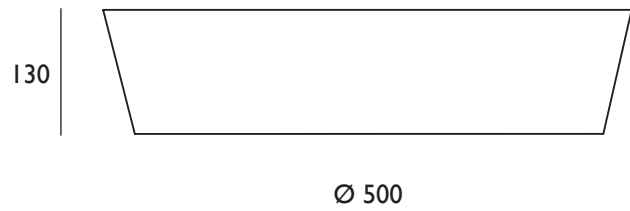
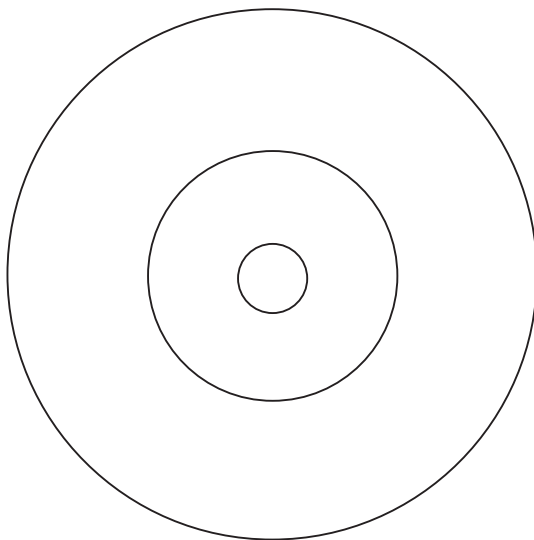
Yki Plafond lamp (1958)

The Yki plafond ceiling lamp is a design classic proudly brought back into production. Its pure white acrylic shade is jazzed up by a centre disc which is available in different colours. Designed over 50 years ago, the lamp can take today's energy saving bulbs, with four energy saving light bulbs for instance casting a rather efficient light.

Colour: white with black or red center

Material: PMMA acrylic

Yki Nummi

Yki Nummi worked as a lighting designer at the Stockmann-Orno lighting fixture factory from 1950 to 1975, designing hundreds of lighting fixtures in this period. He is still considered to be among the most remarkable Scandinavian designers of his time. Nummi's lamps received awards at the Triennials in Milan in 1954, 1957 and 1960.

University studies in mathematics and physics and a degree in decorative painting gave Yki Nummi a firm foundation on which to experiment with the relationship of light and colour in his lighting fixture designs.
